

Brazil - Belém

Project ARCA, which works with street children and children at risk, has undergone some big changes in the last year or so and we are now waiting expectantly for what the Lord is going to do in and through us.

Our work involves a wide range of activities and volunteers are needed in all areas.

In the centre of Belém -

- Street work – visiting kids on streets, taking a snack, singing, devotionals, Bible stories, games.
- Drop in Centre – breakfast, singing, devotionals, activities, teaching.
- Office work – secretarial, administration etc.

In Benevides (about 30 minutes drive from the city)

- Girls Home – day to day care of girls, household activities, educational activities, sports, music, counselling, Bible studies.

In St Isabel (about 45 minutes drive from the city)

- Boys Home – to open in January – much the same needs as girls home.

Other opportunities include prison ministry, family and community work.

If you have building/maintenance skills, you would be a real blessing to the project as there is always repair and renovation work to be done in the homes.

There is plenty of need too for people who can promote, and stimulate support and funding for our work in the UK.

Our girls Hannah, Maria and Sarah study at the International School of Amazonas on the outskirts of Manaus. The school is set in a beautiful location and has a very happy community spirit. Whilst not being a specifically Christian school many of the staff and pupils are Christians. There are over 100 students from several countries, the majority being Brazilians. The curriculum is in English and International G.C.S.E.'s and A' Levels are taken through Cambridge Exam board.
