UFM Worldwide exists to support churches in making disciples of all nations.

Since 1931 we've had the privilege of helping churches to identify, train, send and support workers for cross-cultural mission.

UFM Worldwide is an interdenominational organisation which is clearly evangelical, has a real evangelistic concern and believes in the supreme authority of Scripture.

We take our definition of mission from the one who has authority to send us out into mission – the Lord Jesus Christ.

At its heart, we believe that mission is about making disciples. As God's Word is shared in word and deed, so the Holy Spirit changes lives, churches are established and people grow in their love for the Lord.

Our approach to mission

Committed to the church

The responsibility for identifying, training, sending and supporting workers for cross-cultural mission rests primarily with the local church. Our workers have a sense of God's leading, confirmed by their church. We help churches develop a global vision and partner with churches worldwide in gospel work.

Committed to the gospel

We proclaim, teach and live the truths of biblical,

historic Christianity. We believe that every word of the Bible was inspired by God through human authors, so that the Bible, as originally given, is in its entirety the Word of God – without error and fully reliable in fact and doctrine.

Our mandate is the Great Commission of the Lord Jesus Christ, to "Go and make disciples of all nations ..." (Matthew 28:18-20). Our priority is to take the gospel to leastreached people and to serve under-resourced churches.

Committed to people

We aim to be a family, not

simply an organisation.
We aim to be flexible – our structures are there to serve people as they serve the Lord. We are happy to enable mission workers to go anywhere, if possible. In partnership with sending and receiving churches, pastoral care is a priority.

Committed to the Lord

We acknowledge that the work of mission is the Lord's. We seek to use his tools – his life-changing Word, spoken in the power of the Holy Spirit, in prayerful dependence on the Lord. We look to the Lord to raise up teams of supporters.

Ministry among the least reached

Building on our history as the 'Unevangelised Fields Mission', just over half of UFM workers today are serving among the least reached. These are peoples and places where there aren't enough national believers to see the church more firmly established. This work includes ...

Evangelism – Pioneering in parts of the Middle East and Eurasia, in the form of church planting, personal evangelism, bi-vocational ministry and ministry using IT skills, as well

as evangelistic ministry in South East Asia

Student Ministry – Pioneering student ministry in partnership with IFES Europe

Church planting – Planting churches where there is little gospel witness, for example, the Republic of Ireland (50 towns with no evangelical church), Middle East and Italy

Supporting emerging mission movements – Helping churches to send mission workers to the least reached from Mongolia and Romania

Supporting underresourced churches

As the church in the majority world continues to grow, so does the range of opportunities to serve alongside our brothers and sisters around the world. About half of UFM mission partners work in this way, under local leadership. This work includes ...

Student ministry & international student ministry in Europe

Church leadership and ministry training in places like France, Eastern Europe, Malawi and South East Asia

Theological education in, for example, Peru, Kenya, Togo and Papua New Guinea

Urban poor ministry in Brazil and South East Asia

Medical ministry and work among those with disabilities in Uganda, Moldova and Sierra Leone
